

Scalloped Baby Banner



Materials:

Pun Fun Stamp Set

Short Order Alphabet Stamp Set

Pink Pirouette Classic Ink Pad

Baja Breeze Classic Ink Pad

Basic Black Classic Ink Pad

1 sheet Pink Pirouette card stock 8.5x11

1 sheet Baja Breeze card stock 8.5x11

Scraps of Whisper White (approx half a sheet)

43" approx. of White narrow grosgrain ribbon

12 Silver brads

Blender Pen

Scallop Circle Punch

1 3/8" Circle Punch

Scalloped Edge Punch

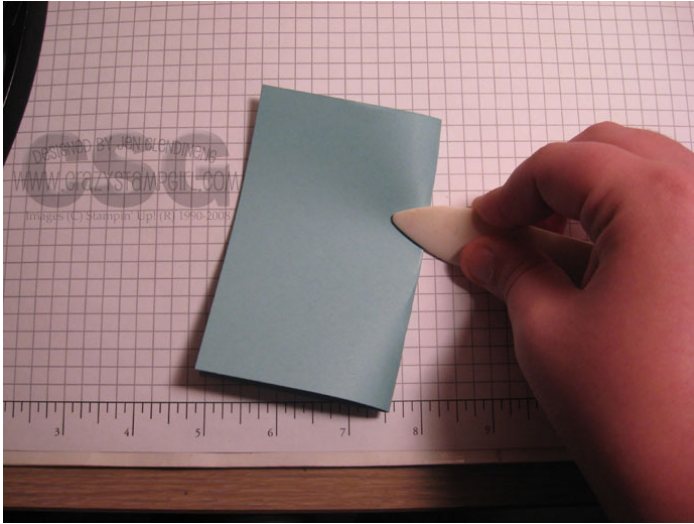

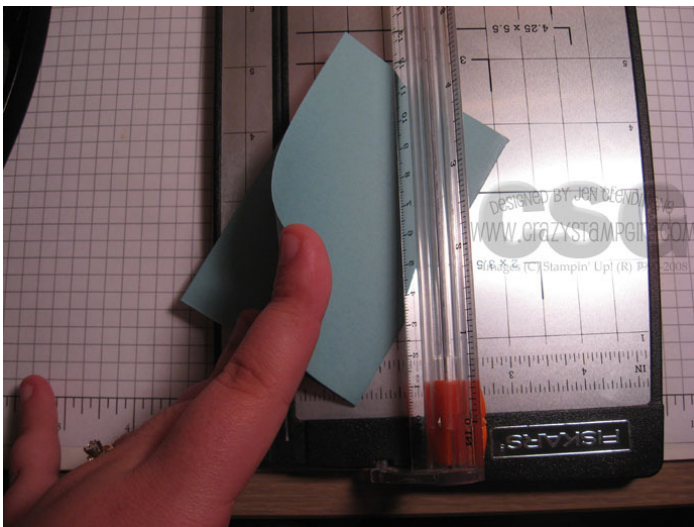
12" Personal Cutter with scoring blade

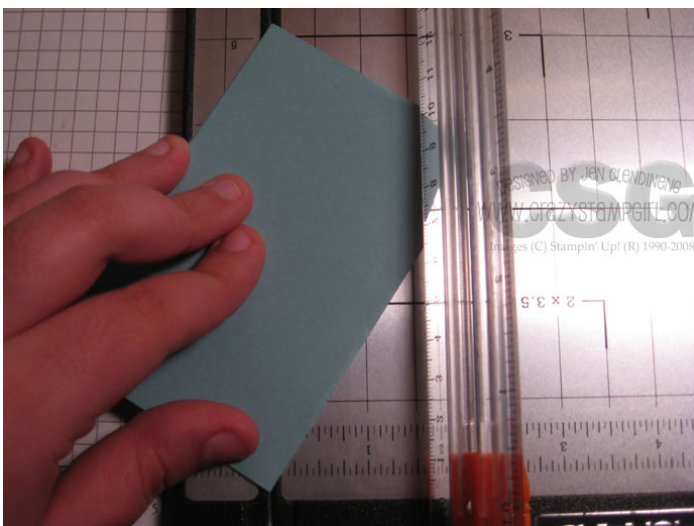

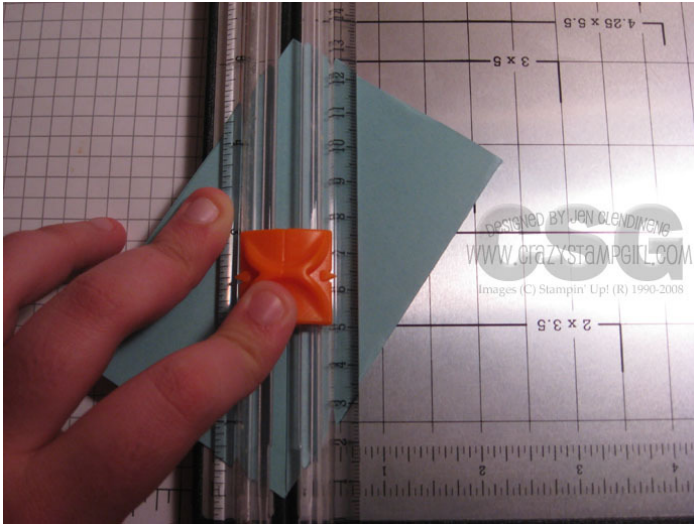
- 1.) Cut both sheets of card stock (Pink Pirouette & Baja Breeze) into quarters: 5.5 inches x 4.25 inches. Fold each quarter piece of in half.



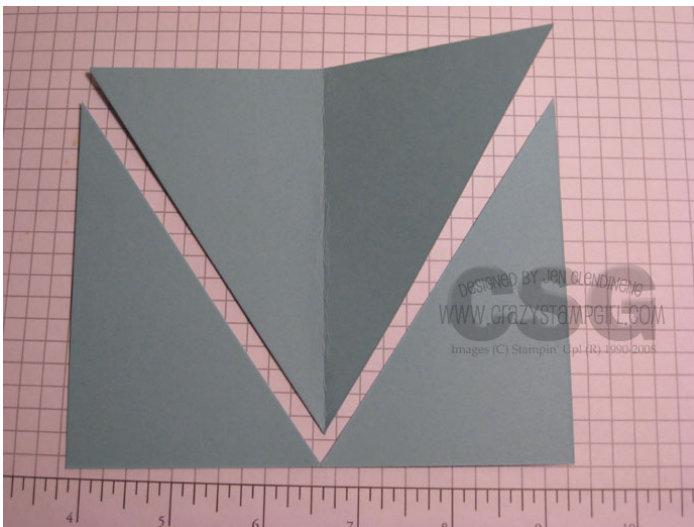
- 2.) With the open side out, slide the folded edge into your paper cutter.



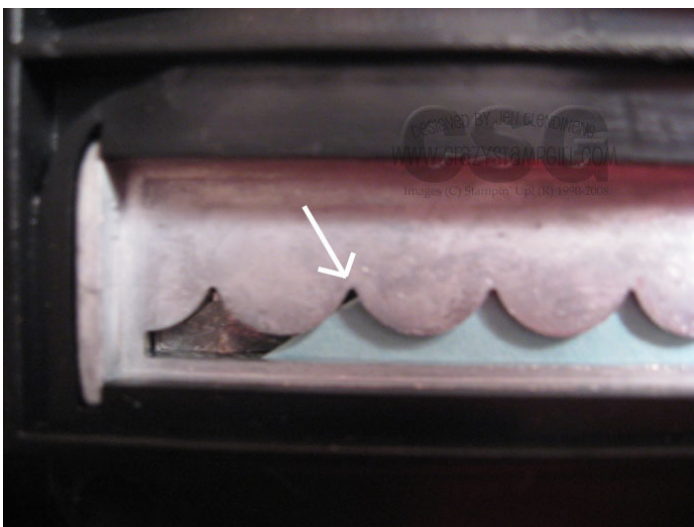
- 3.) Line up the upper left and the lower right corners with the cutting line on your paper cutter.



- 4.) Trim the cardstock corner to corner. It's not necessary to be exact.



- 5.) When you unfold the cardstock, you'll have one large triangle and two separate triangles along the bottom. Separate the large triangles and the small triangles into two piles, but don't throw anything away yet.



- 6.) Take your large triangle and re-fold it in half. Take out your Scalloped Edge punch and flip it over. Now, slide the triangle into the punch with the right angle pointing up and the folded edge leading. Line up the fold with one of the scallops, and leave just a tiny space between

the edge of the cardstock and the top of the scallop.



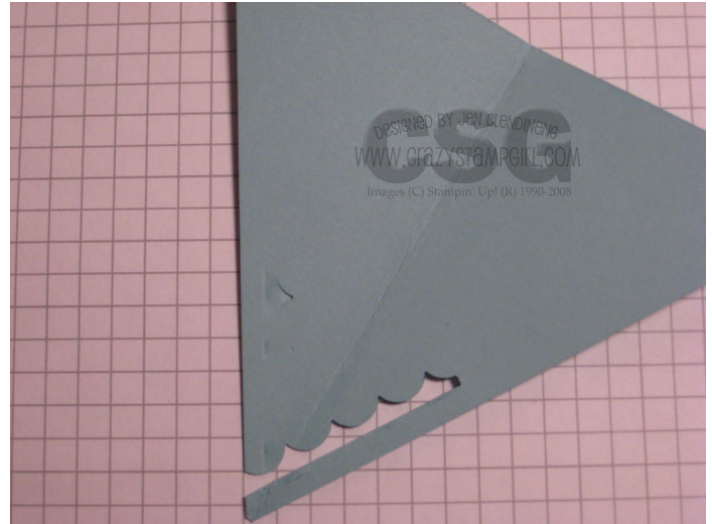
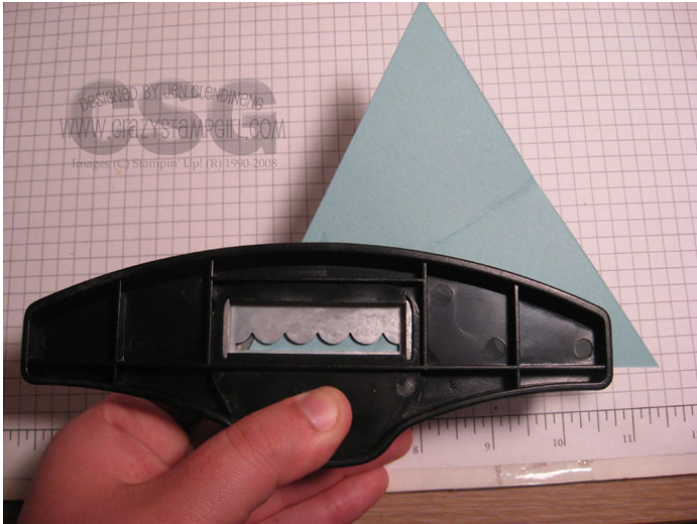
7.) Squeeze the scalloped edge punch like you were punching it, but don't try to punch clear through both layers of cardstock. Just punch it enough to leave a good dent.



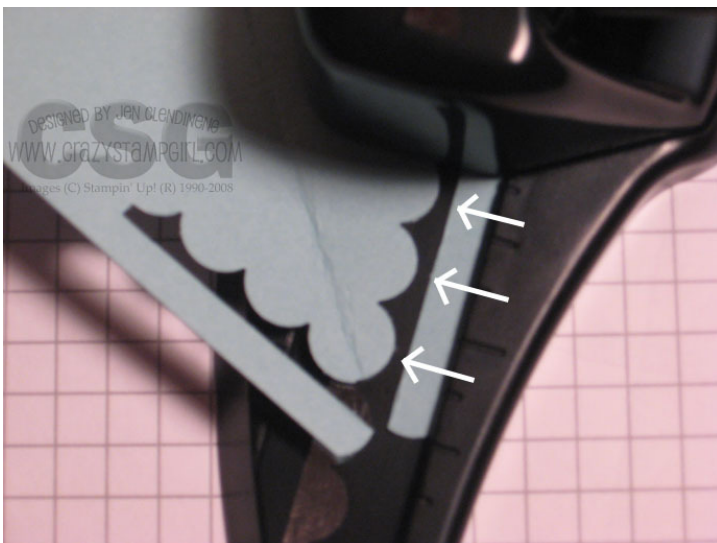
8.) Open the triangle up so you can see the dent along both edges.



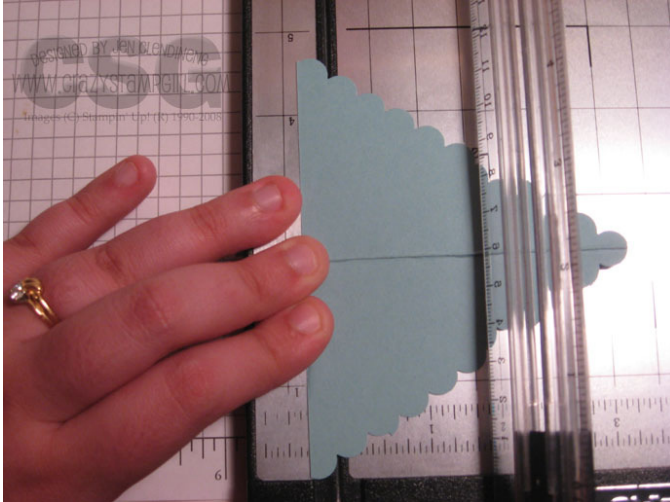
9.) Slide the triangle back into the punch and line up your dent with the scallops.



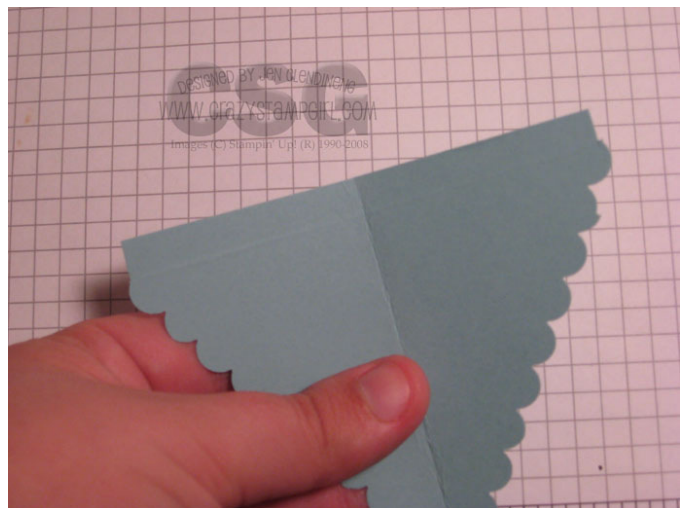
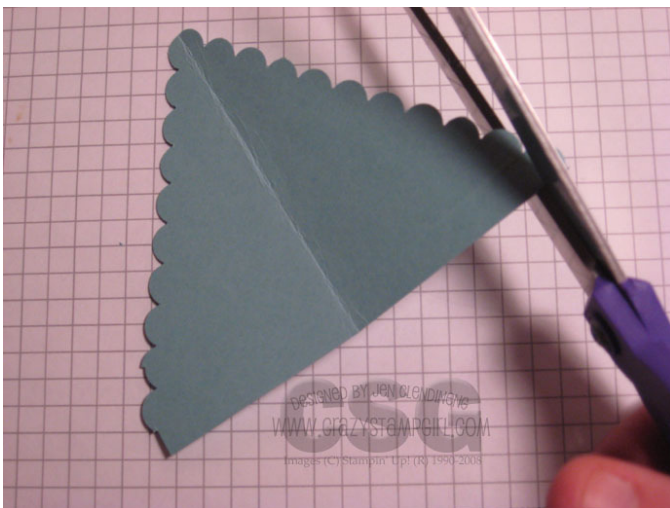
- 10.) Punch once. Flip the triangle over, line it up with the dent on the other edge and punch again.



- 11.) Now, slide either edge back into the punch, only this time hold the punch right side up. Line up your punched scallops with the punched scallops on the guide. Punch again. Continue punching all the way along both edges of the triangle. Leave the top edge straight.



- 12.) Take your triangle and slide it into your paper cutter, lining up the top scallop on each side with the cutting line on your paper cutter. Score all the way across.



- 13.) Trim that top row just inside the second row's scallop so that when you fold on the score line, the top row will be hidden.
- 14.) Repeat these instructions on all of your quartered cardstock pieces in both colors.



15.) Now you need your Whisper White scraps, the Alphabet stamp set and the Pink Pirouette and Baja Breeze classic ink pads.



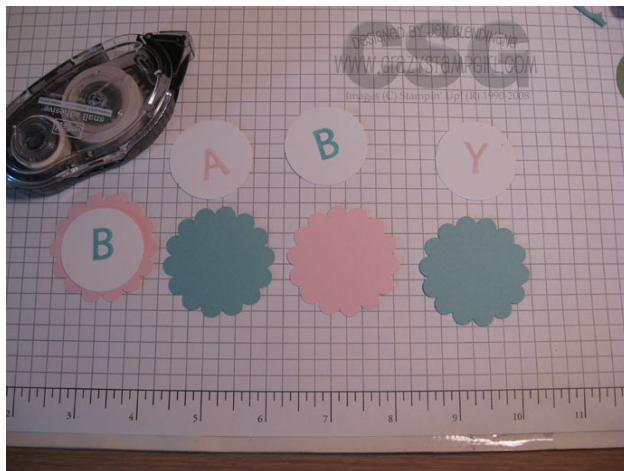
16.) Stamp the letters of in alternating colors. So, in "Baby", I stamped both "B"s in Baja Breeze and the "A" and "Y" in Pink Pirouette.



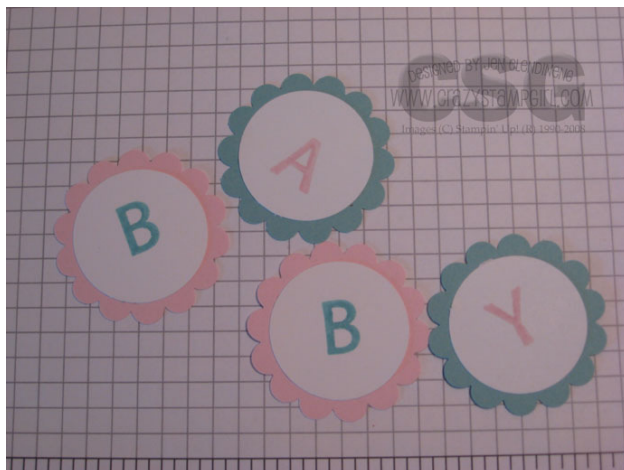
17.) Using the 1 3/8" Circle Punch, punch out each letter.



- 18.) Now go back to the extra small triangles we had leftover earlier and you'll need two pieces in each color. Punch out two scallop circles in each color.

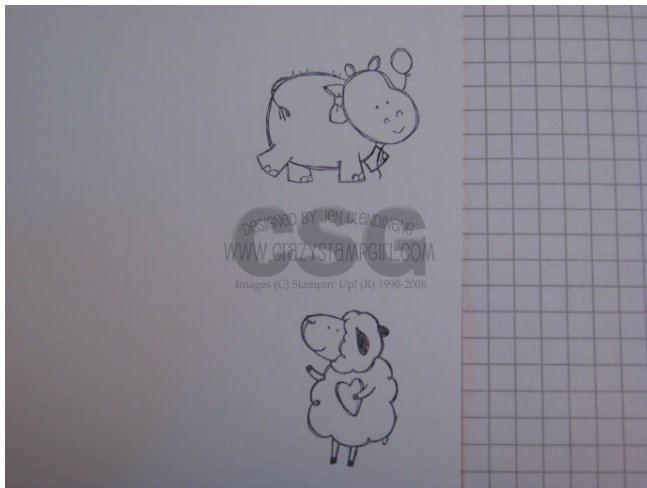


- 19.) Adhere the stamped letters onto the scallop circles of the opposite color.

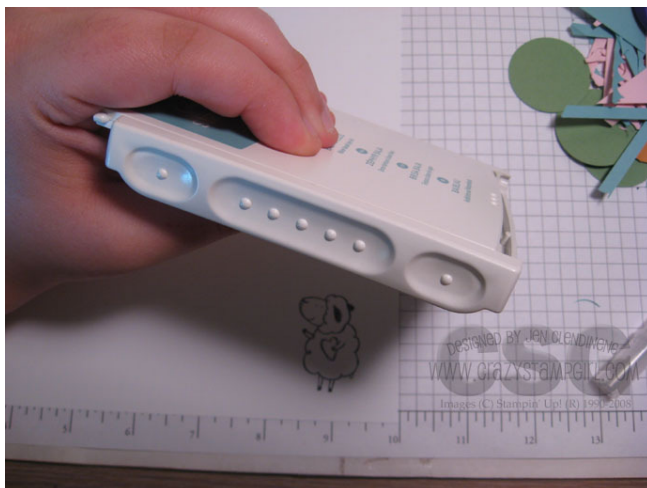




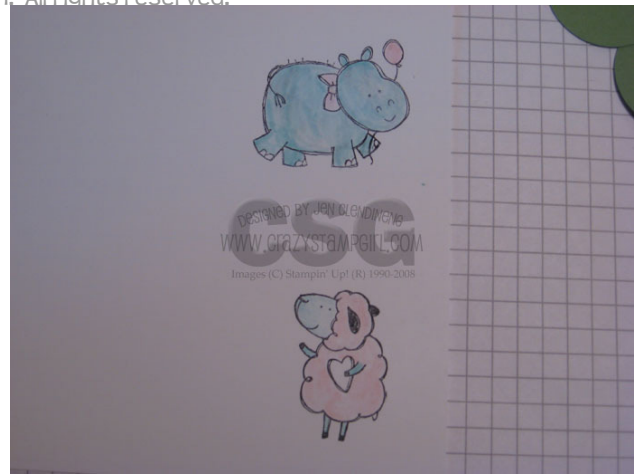
20.) Next you'll need the Basic Black classic ink pad, the Hippo and Sheep from the Pun Fun stamp set and some more Whisper White cardstock scraps.



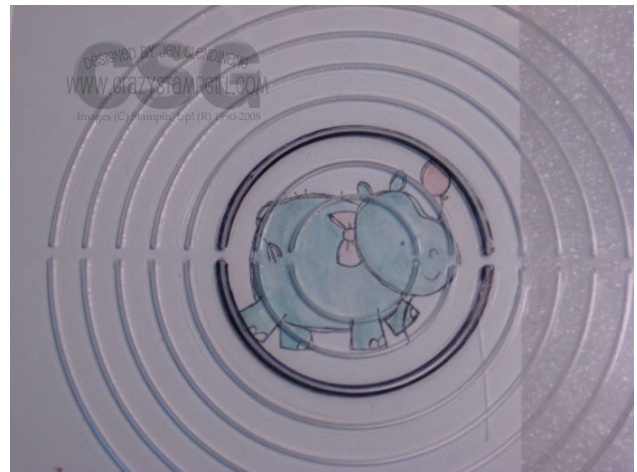
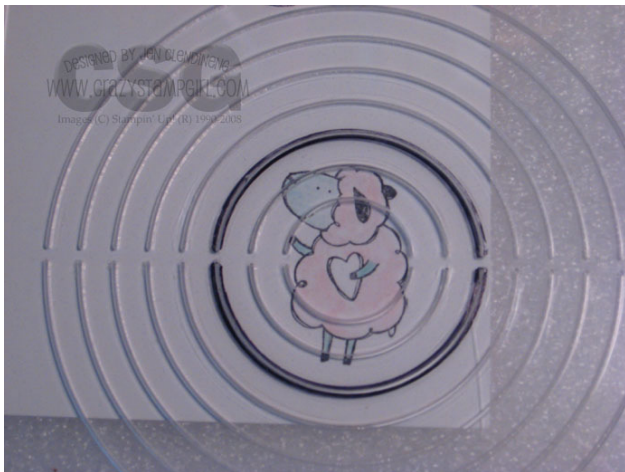
21.) Ink each animal in Basic Black ink, but stamp it once on scrap paper first, before you stamp it on the Whisper White. This way you can have the watercolor ability of Basic Black without the bold black lines on the delicate baby decorations.



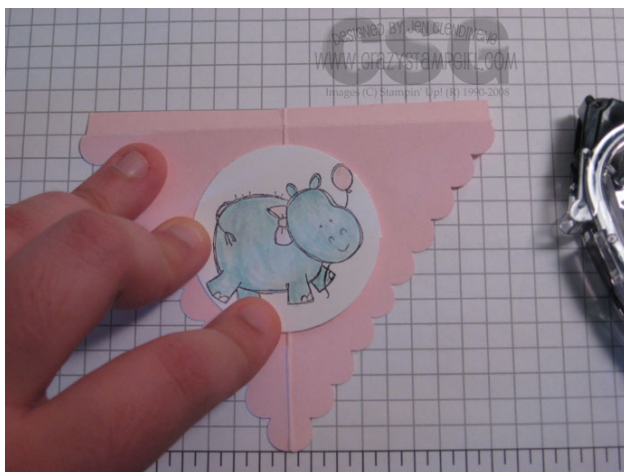
22.) Now, squeeze the lid of the ink pad to create a little puddle of ink on the lid.



- 23.) Take your blender pen and pick up the ink in the lid, and use it to color in the animals we just stamped.



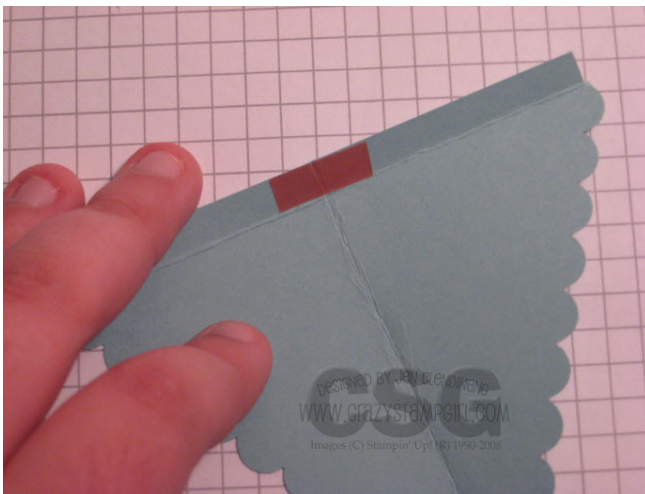
- 24.) Now, we'll need the Coluzzle. Try to center each animal in the 3rd circle from the center and cut it out. (The hippo is a little bit tighter fit than the sheep.)



- 25.) Now, adhere the animals one to each scalloped flag. I used SNAIL, but an Anywhere Glue stick or even the Tombow Multi might stick a little better.



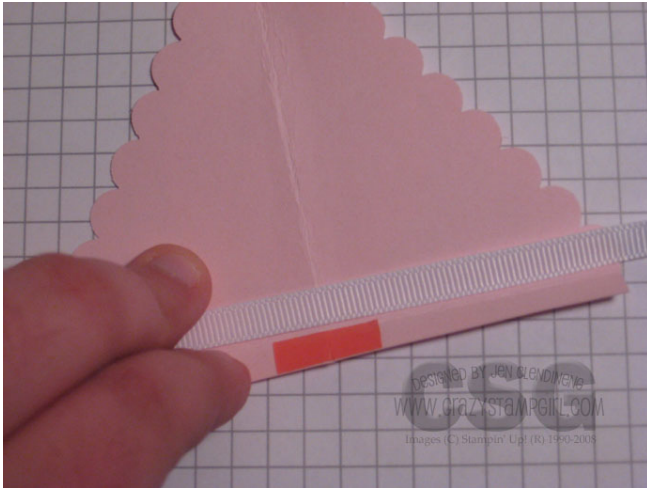
26.) Adhere each letter to one scalloped flag.



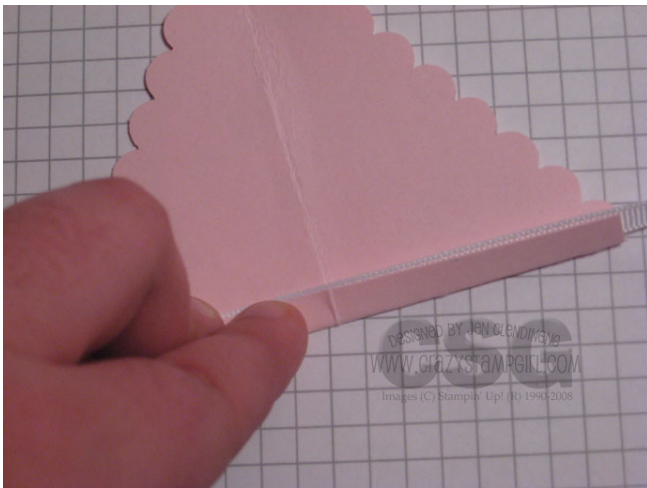
27.) Flip each scalloped flag over and apply a little bit of sticky strip to the center of the fold-over flap. This will hold your ribbon in place.



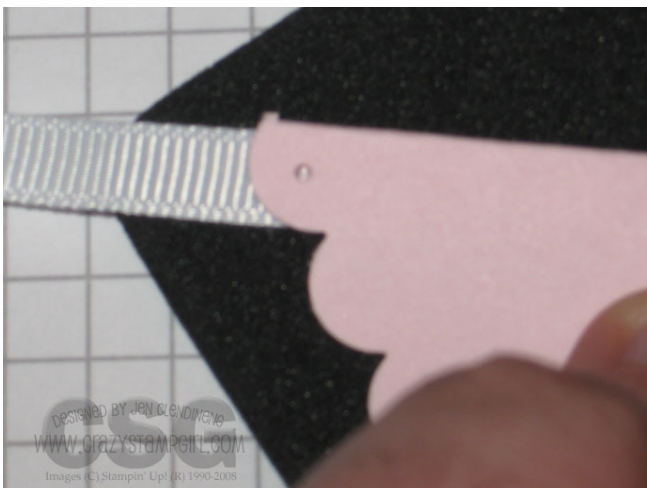
28.) Tie a loop in one end of your grosgrain ribbon.



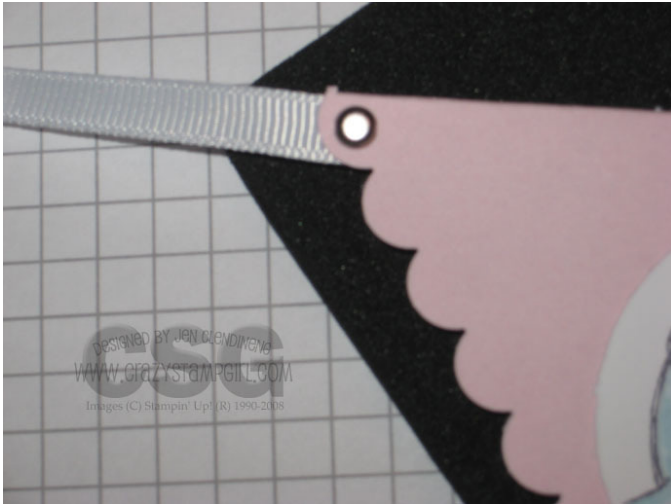
29.) Line up the ribbon along the scored line at the top of the flag.



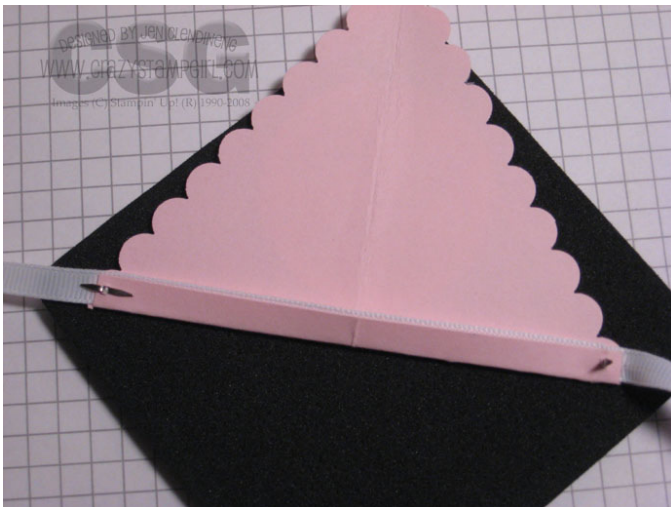
30.) Remove the sticky strip and fold down.



31.) Flip your scalloped flag over so the front is up and place it on the foam mat. Using the paper piercer, poke one hole into each top scallop, being sure to punch through the top layer of cardstock, the ribbon and the folded flap of cardstock underneath.



32.) Put one silver brad in each hole.



33.) Flip the flag back over and flatten the legs of each brad.

34.) Repeat these instructions with all the scalloped flags.



35.) Once all your flags are attached, tie a loop in the final end of the ribbon & you're done!
